“Ali & Nino”, a novel set in pre-Soviet Baku, was originally published in 1937 in German in Vienna, Austria. Our research at Azerbaijan International recently led to the discovery of a Dutch translation which was published the following year (Amsterdam: Van Holkema & Warendorf).

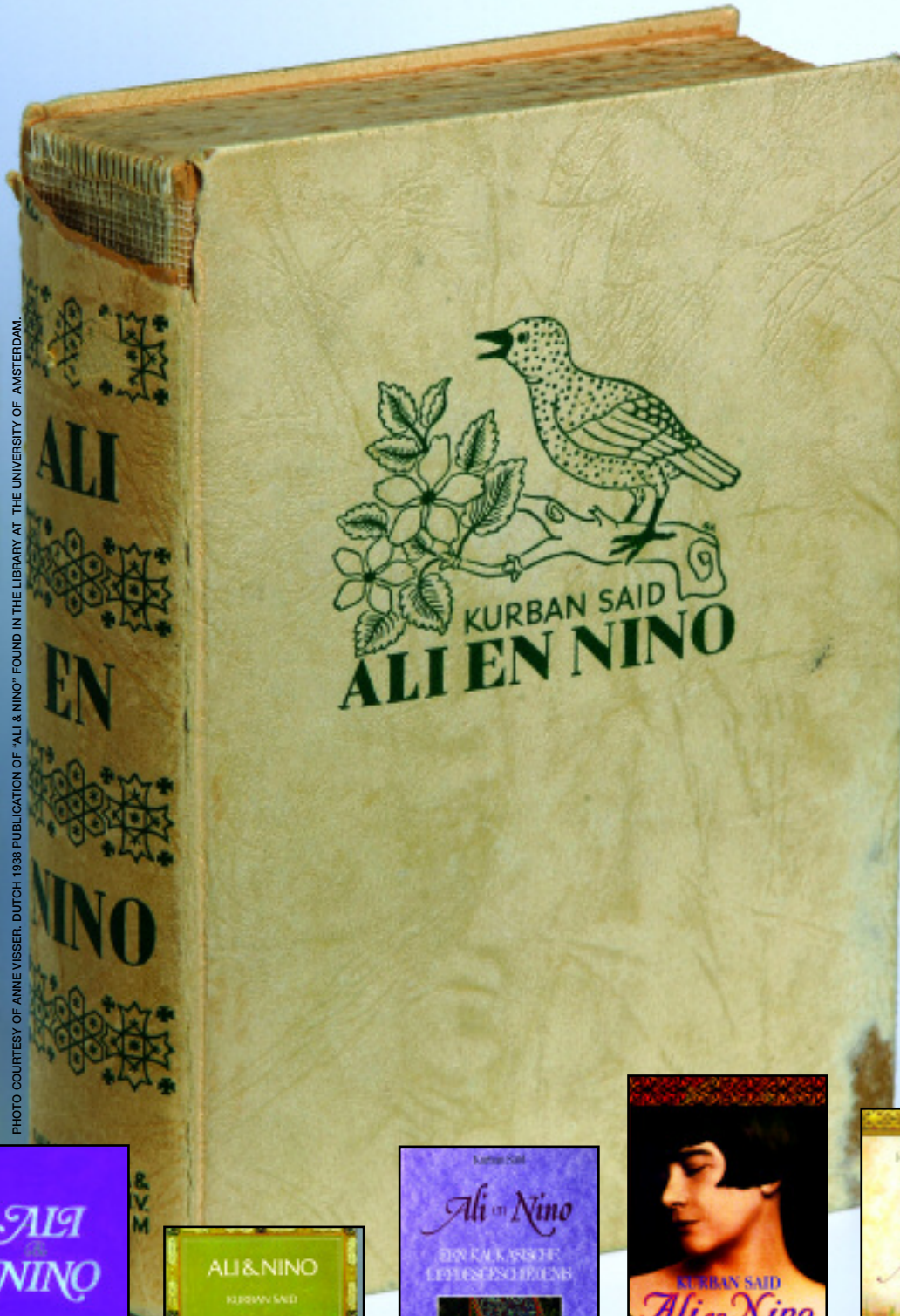
The first page of the 1938 Dutch version advises against reading this novel about an Azerbaijani youth of Muslim upbringing who falls in love with a Georgian princess of Christian heritage. Dutch censors listed it in Group I as controversial, forbidden literature because of its questionable “passionate sections”.

Azerbaijan International highly recommends reading “Ali & Nino” if you want to gain insight into the issues which shaped the Caucasus region historically during last century and which continue to influence many of the major decisions today.

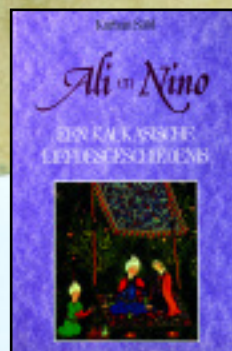

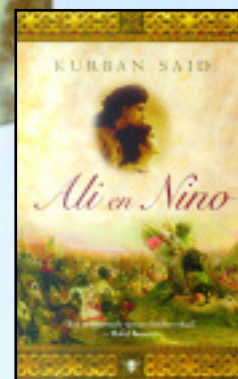
